### The continuing controversy over the causal link between HIV and AIDS

It is almost universally accepted by scientist and health practitioners that the HIV virus causes AIDS. However, from the inception of the AIDS crisis there have been so-called AIDS dissidents or dissenters, who simply do not accept this link. Although some of these dissenters are leading *bona fide* scientists, their views are generally marginalized and are not published in the major scientific-medical journals. The aim of this review is to present the AIDS dissenters viewpoint in a neutral and uncritical manner and to provide an easily acceptable account of the claims of the AIDS dissenters, which the reader can compare with the generally accepted AIDS model and come to their own conclusion as to whether or not the AIDS dissenters have a reasonable case.
