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Impact of implementing designed nursing intervention protocol on clinical outcome of patient with peptic ulcer

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Aim: This study aimed to evaluate the effect of designed protocol for patients with peptic ulcers disease.

Design: A quasi-experimental research design was utilized.

Sample & Setting: Convenience samples of 60 patients with peptic ulcer at Assiut University Hospitals were selected. They are divided into two equal groups matched for age, sex, educational status and co-morbidity.

Method: Tools for data collection were through a structured interview questionnaire and lifestyle assessment. The designed protocol was applied to improve the patient's lifestyle and decrease the rate of complications. The tools were used for pretest before conduction of the designed, protocol, immediate posttest and follow-up at 6 weeks.

Results: The mean knowledge scores and mean practice scores among the study group increased immediately post the program implementation and continued to be high at the follow-up phases. No such improvements could be noticed among the control group throughout the study phases. Statistical significant improvements in study group, fewer complications and some improvement in their life style.

Conclusion: Nursing intervention protocol provided for patient with peptic are necessary to reduce complications and to improve their life style status.

Recommendation: Application of the designed intervention is recommended in similar settings.
