W ith a population of 198,000,000 people, Nigeria has the highest cancer death rate in the world. Studies show that 4 in every 5 women and 805 in 1000 cases of breast cancer result in death. In 2007 the Pink Pearl Foundation created a platform for breast cancer awareness. It was evident that the low rate of information on breast cancer across the nation, 11 years down the line rates of death is still on the rise. Did we not pass the message enough?
